

Each year we host a CEO Banker Day to give the students a real life experience of presenting a business proposal and requesting a loan.

After several months of researching, planning and writing a business plan for their individual businesses, each student meets with and presents their business financials to two local bankers. The students are expected to have a P&L statement and present 3 month projections. Additionally, they are expected to know their profit margin and break even point. The students are also expected to make a request for the amount of money they need to launch.

Concluding the meetings, the Bankers give the Facilitator and CEO Board feedback on how much money each student needs to cover start up costs. Based on this feedback each student is awarded a grant to help them start their businesses.
